

May 19 Torrential Rain Flooding: Disaster Response Reports

1. Summary of the Disaster Situation (Data source: The disaster prevention and relief operations central responsible agency)

With a weather front continuing to affect Taiwan, the Central Weather Bureau issued a heavy rain or extremely heavy rain warning for parts of central and south Taiwan, the north, the northeast and Penghu, and an extremely heavy rain or torrential rain warning for parts of the mountain areas of central and southern Taiwan. Heavy rain in recent days has damaged some roads in central and southern Taiwan, caused agricultural losses, water accumulation and inundation, but luckily there have been no casualties so far. To respond to the disaster that may be caused by continuing torrential rain, the central government's May 19th Central Emergency Operations Center will remain in place. All related departments are requested to be vigilant and to effectively carry of all tasks relating to disaster avoidance, evacuation, provision of shelter and disaster prevention and relief.

8. Key response measures (Data source: Central Emergency Operations Center)

1. The Central Emergency Operation Center held its first advance information judging meeting at 16:00 on May 16 and the second on May 19 at 14:30; the level 2 Central Extremely Heavy Rain Emergency Operations Center at 19:00 on May 19; the first work meeting was held at 20:00.

2. Various departments will remain on alert 24 hours a days, closely monitor Central Weather Bureau rain reports, keep abreast of the disaster situation in key areas and be prepared for horizontal coordination and communication, and to provide for mutual cooperation and support.

(1) The MOEA continues to strengthen reservoir flood discharge warnings, river water level warnings and flood prevention preparations, and is flexibly dispatching pumps and strengthening testing of pump operation in accordance with Central Weather Bureau reports and maintaining a grasp of the disaster situation together with the MOI

(2) In coordination with local county/city government, the MOI and the MOTC has restricted access to blocked roads and is closely monitoring the daily essential supply situation for stranded residents; the CLA and the MOI are monitoring the rainfall situation for villages within the scope of debris flow warnings issued by country government; if it is judged that preventive evacuation is necessary, township chiefs are requested to use their authority to directly issue an evacuation order and implement shelter provision work.

(3) The MOTC is closely monitoring the river water level and upstream rainfall situation and is inspecting roads and bridges where danger can easily occur; in the event that concerns about safety arise, the road or bridge will be closed following a Standard Operating Procedure and vehicles and people prevented from passing. The public will also be provided with a guide to an alternative route; when there is no alternative route, an effort will be made to reopen the bridge/road as soon as possible.

(4) The Ministry of Defense's various combat zones continue to prepare personnel, vehicles, helicopters and equipment, have carried out preparations for forward deployment of relief manpower, and are ready to engage in disaster relief at any time

(5) Media channels are requested to disseminate points for attention for flood-prone areas; members of the public are called upon to take precautions against extremely heavy rain; do not be complacent; to stay safe, avoid the seashore and mountain areas unless necessary.

(6) The CWD forecasts that May 21-23 Taiwan will still be affected by a plum rain front and southwesterly air current and, although the rain will ease, there is still a chance of heavy or extremely heavy rain in parts of west Taiwan; people in low-lying areas in the west should take precautions against inundation; in mountain areas, precautions should be taken against slope and road disaster.
