I. Typhoon Summary (Source: Central Weather Bureau)

The sea warning for Tropical Storm Cimaron was issued at 10:30 on July 17, 2013, and lifted at 11:30 on July 18, 2013. The latest update placed the center of Typhoon No. 8 at sea west of Erluanbi and continuing to move in the northwest direction so it no longer poses any threat to the Bashi Channel and Taiwan Strait. The effect of outer-region circulation from Typhoon No. 8 means localized heavy rain or torrential rain in Taitung (including Lyudao and Lanyu) and the Hengchun Peninsula today (7/18). Hualien, Yilan, southern Taiwan, the mountain areas of Chiayi as well as Penghu and Kinmen means localized heavy rain or torrential rain. There is a chance that areas north of central Taiwan may experience localized heavy rain in the afternoon. Please watch out for sudden storms, lightning strikes, strong winds or flash floods. Low-lying areas should take precautions against flooding. Torrential rain regions: Taitung County, Pingtung County. Shipping sailing through or operating in the waters near Taiwan as well as Dongsha Island should take care due to persistent strong winds and high waves.
