

**Typhoon Doksuri Press Release from the Central Emergency Operation Center**  
**Cabinet strategy group**

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**Sea Warning Issued for Weak Typhoon-Typhoon Doksuri**  
**The Public Asked to be Vigilant**

The Central Weather Bureau issued a sea warning for Typhoon Doksuri at 5.30 am this morning (28) and this was followed by the establishment of the Central Emergency Operation Center (CEOC) at 8.30am. Members of the public are requested to pay attention to the latest typhoon information, take the necessary precautions in advance and cooperate with the government's typhoon response measures.

A CEOC spokesperson said that the typhoon's center was over the sea approximately 540 kilometers to the southeast of Eluanbi at 8 am on June 28 and was moving west-north-west at 23 kmh. Affected by Typhoon Doksuri, from this (28) evening ,Taiwan's east, southeast and the Hengchun Peninsula will see very heavy rain in places and, from tomorrow (29)afternoon, there will be a chance of heavy or very heavy rain in south Taiwan, so people are requested to make the necessary preparations.

In its first report meeting, the deputy commander of the CEOC asked each unit to continue monitoring the typhoon situation and provide prompt and accurate information analysis for the reference of local governments. With the storm circle already in the Bashi Channel, the aquaculture industry and boats working at sea along the southeast coast of Taiwan should take evasive measures. If outlying island ferries and flights are suspended operators are asked to inform the public promptly through the media; with the typhoon's peripheral circulation likely to bring quite heavy rains, he called on local governments to make preparations to preventively evacuate and provide shelter for residents of high-risk areas when necessary.

With winds quite strong and waves relatively large already, the CEOC call on members of the public to stay away from rivers and the ocean and refrain from engaging in ocean-based activities during the period that Taiwan is affected by this typhoon.
